From the Pastor



Dear Friends in Christ,

I just spent a week at the pastor's equivalent to Disney World. The Festival of Homiletics is a week of learning about preaching specifically, but more generally it is focused on faith and our daily lives. As a pastor I am privileged that my job is centered around what it means to live a life of faith. Most people of faith strive to live faithfully while working a job with

another specific focus.

I want to try something this summer that will let us work together on pondering and incorporating our faith into our daily lives. I would like you to join me in a summer Sunday School adventure where we explore the Scripture readings together that will be the focus for our worship the following Sunday. We will gather in the parlor following worship. Any Sunday that someone is hosting coffee fellowship, we will spend thirty minutes enjoying fellowship with others before diving into our study.

I will encourage you to read the passages before class. If you don't have time to do so, please come to class anyway. We will focus on some basic questions and see where the conversation takes us. The questions we will ponder include:

What did you notice in the passage? Did anything surprise you? Did anything confuse you? Did anything encourage you?

Where could you imagine yourself in this passage?

What does this passage have to say to my life today? What does this passage have to say to our world today?

If there is something mentioned in the passage that you have some knowledge about, be prepared to share that with us. If

there is something in the passage that interests you, feel free to do some research ahead of time and share what you have learned. For instance, there is a story coming up this summer that includes a herd of pigs. I don't know anything about pigs except that I like bacon. Maybe you do, or you are interested enough to do a little research.

This class will be open to all ages. As a family you could read and talk about the texts then come to class together.

We will begin this summer Sunday School on June 19th. Here are the passages to read ahead of time:

2 Kings 2:1-2, 6-14

Psalm 77:1-2, 11-20

Galatians 5:1, 13-25

Luke 9:51-62

I hope you will join me for a summer of Bible study together.




